FROM NICHOLAS

The congregation at All Saints expressed a strong desire to receive Holy Communion in both kinds as Upnor has recently started doing. Sharing the common cup as previously does not, at present, seem wise so administration will be by intinction by the priest. A 'dipped' wafer will be placed in the hands of the communicant as at present and people will be invited forward, socially distanced' and with a mask, to receive.

- Those who are gluten-free will be administered first to avoid transferring gluten to the wine.
- Those who have mobility difficulties will be given communion in situ as at present.
- Those who wish to continue to only receive in one kind will continue to able to do so.
- Those who only wish to receive blessing will continue to able to do so.

It will probably feel a bit strange and if it doesn't work as well as the CWs and I hope, we will review it.

COVID PRECAUTIONS FOR SERVICES

I am sure we have all seen the news regarding the very sharp escalation in COVID cases. Whilst the likelihood of severe illness is much reduced because of the vaccination programme, the forecast high number of infections means that there is still likely to be a significant numbers of hospitalisations. Throughout the pandemic we have met, and often exceeded, the precautions and protocols required. This is demonstrated by the fact that even with the introduction of Plan B we will not have to do anything in addition to what we are currently doing.

HOWEVER, that does not leave room for complacency and I have been giving careful thought to our Sunday worship and Christmas services. Further guidance may yet emerge, but as it stands, we will continue with our regular Sunday worship and the All Saints Carol service. I will take steps to shorten services and, for the time being, we will suspend the serving of refreshments. I would appreciate your support in the following areas:

- 1. **Please book** for Christmas services so we can manage seating.
- 2. Please take a lateral flow test no more than 24 hours before attending worship.
- 3. **Do not attend** if you have any of the following: a high temperature, a new, continuous cough and a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste.
- 4. **If you are more vulnerable**, because of age, underlying health conditions, are not 'boosted', or you live with those who are vulnerable you may want to consider choosing the number and type of services you attend.
- 5. **Please follow guidance given** by the welcomers on the day; hand sanitising, seating, social distancing etc.
- 6. **Wearing of face coverings is now mandatory** in places of worship unless you have medical exemption.
