FROM NICHOLAS

As we have begun to emerge from COVID, with significant rises in the cost of living, the events in Ukraine have overwhelmed us. For many, the wilderness experience has been a very real one this Lent and indeed over the past two years. We have felt lost and alone. The temptations Jesus faced are timeless – distortion of the truth, greed and lust for power. We have seen the terrible consequences of succumbing to them.

Resurrection and hope were found by the disciples in the realities of life, the brutality of the Roman empire and the political intrigues of the day. My Easter prayer is that, for all of us, in the realities of our lives that the meaning of the resurrection will be more powerful and real than it has ever been.

BISHOP OF ROCHESTER

It is wonderful that just before we prepare to enter Passiontide that HM The Queen has approved the nomination of the Rt Rev Jonathan Gibbs as the next Bishop of Rochester.

Bishop Jonathan is currently the Bishop of Huddersfield in the Diocese of Leeds. He also holds the national portfolio of Lead Bishop for Safeguarding, a role he will bring with him into his post as Bishop of Rochester. His PhD was in the theology of work.

He is married to Toni and they have three children. His interests include walking, usually accompanied by their Cocker Spaniel, and rummaging in second-hand bookshops. He is a fluent French speaker with a love of France, and especially its wines. He also speaks German and Swiss-German. He and his wife, who originally met when working in Paris, enjoy entertaining and making new friends. Jonathan is also a member of the Campaign to Protect Rural England and the Campaign for Real Ale, committed to supporting village and community life. Jonathan was consecrated as Bishop of Huddersfield in York Minster on 17 October 2014.
