FROM NICHOLAS

The Teddy Bears' Picnic was blessed with beautiful weather on Sunday 8 May and a great time was had by all. Fifty, teddies, pandas (which are not members of the bear family), superheroes, lions, cats, dogs, frogs and even a knitted pterodactyl safely made history as the first zipliners from the tower in 800 years. It wasn't intended as a major fund raiser but nevertheless about £300 was raised retrospectively for the repairs to the tower that were completed last year. We had a few families pass through the churchyard without teddies, but some donated teddies were duly adopted and found new homes!

The Frindsbury Handbell Ringers concert on Friday 6 May was enjoyed by all and £340 was added to the Ukraine Dec appeal. It contained an interesting variety of music and techniques including, rather poignantly, the Ukrainian national anthem.

Thanks to those who served refreshments and provided logistical support. Neither of these events could have happened without you.

COVID PRECAUTIONS

We have continued to exercise a considerable degree of caution with respect to COVID. However, because of vaccination, the risk of serious illness is much reduced as many in our congregation will testify. However, others church members have known a different experience amongst friends and family.

It is very difficult to balance different kinds risks, but I suspect many feel that by not lifting some of our precautions we risk losing visitors or of creating the wrong impression, given that the society is moving on and learning to live with COVID. Since the lifting of all legal restrictions, local decisions are the responsibility of the Incumbent alone. I am therefore inviting your prayerful reflection in advance of the APCM on what you think is right for you, for others and for our witness.

I am currently minded to suggest that we remove the requirement for social distancing and masks whilst allocating an area of the church for those who wish to observe those measures. I would also like to re-introduce reception at the communion rail and am considering offering a common cup in addition to the current practice of intinction. It would be helpful if you could respond to me so that I can get a wide breadth of opinion before the APCM.

PARKING AND ACCESS - note 22 May

Traffic is still quite busy to Upnor with the resumption of the Boot Fair. It particularly affects those travelling to Upnor. Also, parking at Upnor due to the change of use of the Old Vicarage is becoming quite restricted. Please park well and be particularly careful of, and as, pedestrians on Upchat and Upnor Roads.

We have a baptism on Sunday 22 and are welcoming families and friends of Lincoln and Jasmine. Please consider using Parsonage Lane if possible.

Do join us for our spring walk to and around Broomhill Park. This is a varied and attractive urban and park walk. The shorter walk (just over two miles) will return from the lower park. The walk to the park is

a relatively gentle set of ups and downs with nearly all of it on footpaths and pavements. We will return for hot or cold drinks, and tasty treats.
