with parade followed by lunch with the 27th All Saints Scouts on Church Green

4.00pm BCP Evensong, followed by afternoon tea. The choir will be singing an anthem

written for the Jubilee.

12 June, Trinity 1 (second Sunday of the month)

8.30am Upnor Morning Worship

10.00am Holy Communion

19 June, Trinity (third Sunday of the month)

We revert to our normal pattern

8.30am Upnor, Morning Worship

10.00am Holy Communion

DELAY TO RECORDED SERVICES

I apologise to those who normally receive recorded services by post. I have had to prioritise pastoral offices over the last two weeks so I am a little behind with editing and subtitling. I hope to catch up over the bank holiday weekend.

APCM

Most will be aware that we were unable to elect churchwardens at the APCM. This is not an unusual situation. As requested, a role description will be prepared for potential candidates. In the interim I will ask some PCC members to take on specific responsibilities so that nothing 'falls down the cracks'.

LIFTING OF COVID PRECAUTIONS

I received a few comments regarding the lifting of our guidance. COVID is still with us but the vast majority feel it is something we will have to live with and therefore are content that we should move on. From this point forward:

- 1. We will continue to encourage good hand hygiene.
- 2. Socially distanced chairs will be seat out at the back of church. All other pews will be available.
- 3. People will no longer be actively encouraged to wear face coverings but may choose to do wherever they are sitting.

- 4. We will re-instate the passing of the collection plate.
- 5. It is important that the sharing of the peace does not exclude people, and does not make people uncomfortable. So, further comments are invited.
- 6. The communion rails will be reintroduced for reception of the bread and wine.
- 7. At present, we will continue with intinction, by the priest, of wafers at communion.

ACCESSIBILITY

As we review our practice for living with COVID, the north aisle has potential for better provision (than pre-COVID) for a creche area. I am also mindful of the needs for accessibility (wheelchairs and audiovisual requirements). I suspect it likely that our socially distanced seating will be located at the back of the church. This is actually outside the area of the audio loop. However, I understand that hearing aid technology has moved on and for most, the loop is not needed. I would be very grateful if some hearing aid users could enlighten me, in case an extension to the loop is needed. We also have the ability for tablet users to access a high contrast enlarged view of what is projected on the screen. If this would be helpful and you do not already access it, please let me know.

Any arrangements that entail moving pews or other significant items will be a temporary trial under an Archdeacon's Licence before making them permanent by faculty.
