#### FROM NICHOLAS

Many thanks to all who contributed to, and helped with, our Platinum Jubilee celebrations last weekend. It was a once in a lifetime event for all of us. Thanks particularly to the 27<sup>th</sup> All Saints Scouts for their generosity in preparing and sharing lunch.

I noticed in St Philip and St James a stained-glass window dedicated in thanksgiving of 60 years of Queen Victoria's reign. The window next to it is plain glass. Unfortunately, stained glass is skilled craft, and therefore costly. Our church finances are required for remedial building work. However, if anyone knows a (wealthy!) individual wishing to donate a window, they would make a nice pair!

#### **APCM**

Most will be aware that we were unable to elect churchwardens at the APCM. This is not an unusual situation. As requested, a role description will be prepared for potential candidates. In the interim I will ask some PCC members to take on specific responsibilities so that nothing 'falls down the cracks'.

#### LIFTING OF COVID PRECAUTIONS

I received a few comments regarding the lifting of our guidance. COVID is still with us but the vast majority feel it is something we will have to live with and therefore are content that we should move on. From this point forward:

- 1. We will continue to encourage good hand hygiene.
- 2. Socially distanced chairs will be seat out at the back of church. All other pews will be available.
- 3. People will no longer be actively encouraged to wear face coverings but may choose to do wherever they are sitting.
- 4. We will re-instate the passing of the collection plate.
- 5. It is important that the sharing of the peace does not exclude people, and does not make people uncomfortable. So, further comments are invited.
- 6. The communion rails will be reintroduced for reception of the bread and wine.
- 7. At present, we will continue with intinction, by the priest, of wafers at communion.

## PARISH WALK TO BEACON HILL AND SHEPPEY BRIDGE VIEW

11am Saturday 18 June 2022 Meet UPNOR CHURCH ME2 4UX (crossroads of Upnor Road & Upchat Road)

We are four years old! Do join us for our 4th Anniversary walk in lovely countryside. This month we meet at St Philip and St. James, Upnor church and there are two options:

- Shorter walk 2 miles
- Longer walk 3.5 miles

Both walks start (and finish) at the church, climbing Beacon Hill through attractive woodland. After a brief trip along the ridge at the top, the short walk descends to the Medway foreshore for fine views of the river. The longer walk has an extension through agricultural land along part of the Saxon Shore Way, with Sheppey Bridge always visible on a good day, before returning via the same foreshore route. There may be a Spot the Crop competition!

The walk for all begins with the short but steep ascent of Beacon Hill. The rest of the walk is level or downhill. There is one path on the longer walk which is fairly overgrown with grass. Trousers would be better than shorts. Please note: To avoid the need for signing in please reserve a place by e mailing <a href="mailto:pa@allsaintsfrindsbury.org.uk">pa@allsaintsfrindsbury.org.uk</a> High-vis straps/harnesses will be available for wear (but are not compulsory). Dogs on leads welcome; children under 14 must be accompanied.

\* Please note all participants walk at their own risk. We may take photos of the adults to share on social media and promote our activities, unless you let us know you do not wish your photo to be taken. We will keep a record of those attending for NHS Track and Trace purposes. Please ensure social distancing at all times.

#### **ACCESSIBILITY**

As we review our practice for living with COVID, the north aisle has potential for better provision (than pre-COVID) for a creche area. I am also mindful of the needs for accessibility (wheelchairs and audiovisual requirements). I suspect it likely that our socially distanced seating will be located at the back of the church. This is actually outside the area of the audio loop. However, I understand that hearing aid technology has moved on and for most, the loop is not needed. I would be very grateful if some hearing aid users could enlighten me, in case an extension to the loop is needed. We also have the ability for tablet users to access a high contrast enlarged view of what is projected on the screen. If this would be helpful and you do not already access it, please let me know.

Any arrangements that entail moving pews or other significant items will be a temporary trial under an Archdeacon's Licence before making them permanent by faculty.
