Saturday 8th October at 11am -2pm

Our EcoChurch group is holding a Clothes Swapping event in the church hall on 8th October from 11am to 2pm. Come and swap good quality items from your wardrobe that you no longer wear for something "new to you".

To take part you need to bring a minimum of 1 item and a maximum of 10. You will get 1 token per item to exchange for



something else from the event. Clothes will need to be clean and good quality - no rips, tears, missing buttons, broken zips, stains, no underwear will be accepted. We need ladieswear, menswear, children and babies clothes (can also accept shoes and boots in good condition). We would also like donations of coat hangers for the event and if you have a display rail we could borrow for the event, please let us know.

Did you know?

According to WRAP's 'Valuing our clothes' report:

- * around 30% of clothing in our wardrobes has not been worn for at least a year
- * an estimated £140 million worth (about 350,000 tonnes) of used clothing goes to landfill in the UK each year
- * extending the average life if clothes by just three months would lead to a 5-10% reduction in each of the carbon, water and waste footprints.

What can you do?

Have a look through your clothes and have a look to see if there is anything you don't wear and bring to our Clothes Swap event or donate it to a charity shop.
