### **FROM NICHOLAS**

### **TURKEY-SYRIA APPEAL**

Thank you to those who contributed to our post-service collection for Turkey and Syria last week. Whilst there have been some remarkable stories of rescue, the overwhelming news has been of inconceivable devastation. The death toll is now in excess of 45,000 – nearly three times the population of our parish. The rebuilding task is massive, but immediate concerns are getting basic aid to those who need it, and rebuilding infrastructure. The DEC appeal remains open.

### **STAFF TEAM AWAY DAY**

For three years our plans as a church have been disrupted and affected by Covid. We have had to be reactive rather than proactive. Even this past Christmas we had a plan 'B' for cover at the major services. I am hopeful that we are beginning to settle down into a more stable pattern. The Staff Team will be going on an Away Day with Archdeacon Andy, partly to recharge our batteries but also to receive some encouragement and inspiration with respect to our Church vision and mission. # **SAFEGUARDING TRAINING - RAISING AWARENESS OF DOMESTIC ABUSE**

The PCC are grateful to Vicki Webster for running the CofE safeguarding training 'Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse' on Tuesday 21 Feb. It is not a comfortable topic, and I think it fair to say that all of us were shocked by the statistics indicating the prevalence of such abuse. Sadly, it is increasing.

## **APCM**

The PCC has agreed our APCM date will be the 30 April 2023. It is a fifth Sunday of the month and the service will be held at All Saints. It will therefore be a communion service and although we normally hold our APCM in the context of worship, this will be the first time we have held it during a communion service. It will be slightly longer than usual, but we will try to be efficient in the business and the sermon will be shorter.

We will have elections for:

**Churchwardens:** See my opening notice.

**Deanery Synod:** These are elected for the next three year sitting of the synod and become, *ex officio*, members of the PCC.

**PCC Members**: In this parish they are elected each year. Currently under the Church Representation Rules we have to agree that Readers become, *ex officio*, members of the PCC.

**Electoral Roll:** The revision of our Electoral Roll will take place from 3-7 April 2023. The new roll will be published on Sunday 9 April. The Electoral Roll is our church membership list - being on the roll allows you to stand as a church officer and to vote at the APCM. Most of you will already be on the existing roll and therefore do not need to complete a new form but please check the list at the back of our churches. To join the roll, please complete a form which is at the back of churches and pass to Andrew Whiteley, Electoral Roll Officer, or Sue, Administrator. Forms need to be returned by the end of April, please.

Please note that all those standing for election must be prepared to sign a 'Fit and Proper Person' form and complete the necessary declaration to enable a DBS check. If you have any questions regarding this, please see Sue Jones, PCC Secretary.

### **LENT COURSE 2023**

This Lent we are all invited to explore how we can live well with the mess of everyday life. The Church of England course, **Dust and Glory**, encourages us to take a fresh look at the frustrations and failings that every day brings and, rather than pretending we can always avoid them, seek to learn from them and grow closer to God through them.

There are several ways to take part:

- Read through Lent the **Dust and Glory booklet** with daily readings and reflections (you can get a digital version and we will have paper copies available)
- Read the book Failure by Emma Ineson (the book on which the course is based)
- Take part as a family with daily activities and challenges with the Dust and Glory booklet: A Lent Journey for Children (available as digital version and we will have paper copies available if you prefer)
- Join a Lent Group, meeting with others to discuss the book and watch the course films together (groups meet during the day and evenings – ask for details). Existing homegroups continue but, as usual there will be a specific Lent group formed for those who seek it.
- Social Media Follow Dust and Glory on Church of England social media (Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, Instagram) for daily updates; for younger people The Way UK Failing Forward will feature on TikTok
- Listen The Daily Hope phone line will also have some of the course resources.
